THE FIVE 'SYSTEMS' OF A FRUITFUL PARISH – FELLOWSHIP

In the book of Acts we read that the early Christian community '...devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.' (Acts 2:42). Among devotion to the apostles' teaching, Eucharist and prayer is fellowship, an essential ingredient parish life. What is fellowship and what does it look like in parish life today? One way to understand what it should look like is to ask, 'are we a meaningful community where people are known and loved and supported in their call to holiness.'

At the most basic level we know that fellowship looks like social gatherings, and these are great and necessary things, especially to maintain a strong sense of hospitality and welcome. Fellowship doesn't stop here, in fact, for fellowship to be truly what the quote from Acts above intends, then its centre need to be the Gospel. Gospel centred fellowship is seen when our goal is to accompany each other in our journey to holiness. Consider the following questions: Is everyone in our parish known by name, loved and cared for? Is anyone left out of our fellowship? Does our fellowship extend to all ethnicities, people with disabilities and people from a variety of socioeconomic backgrounds? Let us pray that our praying, fasting and giving during this Lenten season will inspire us to love and accompany each other on our shared journey to holiness.
