The parable for us to reflect this week is all about how merciful the Lord is to the humble. The Pharisee and the Tax-Collector are two symbols of our spirituality. One that we should shed another that we should inculcate. The picturization of the pharisee and tax collector go beyond their cultural significance to the spiritual significance to date.

The pharisee is symbol of self-righteousness. It leads you to believe just the outward observance can justify no matter how contaminated your inner being is. Practices of tithing, fasting, observing prayer times would be enough to be saved. And by these you make yourself worthy of salvation.

The tax collector, on the other hand, is symbol of humility that's integral to our relationship with God. Accepting the frailty of human nature, unworthiness and knowing only God's grace is what makes one worthy of justification, the man does not dare even to lift up the head to look at God. Our justification comes from God, for, only He can do take away our unworthiness.

The scripture, especially the New Testament, pictures the tax collectors as the vessel of God's mercy. They were considered to be outcasts for few reasons like,

- Equal to gentiles: Since they, on account of their frequent contact with the gentiles. By Pharisaic standards, this meant that collectors were exposed to the ritual defilement of the pagans
- Betrayers: since taxes were collected for the unwelcome Romans, who ruled over the Jews, collectors were branded as traitors to Israels hope for national independence.
- Guilty of extortion: since exacting personal commissions above the required tax amount.

But in the eyes of Jesus, and from His association with them, there is far greater good news revealed:

- Transformation and repentance: Their stories show that anyone, no matter how sinful their past, can be transformed by faith and obedience to Jesus. Eg: Zacchaeus & Levi (Matthew)
- **Restitution and Justice:** Repentance is not springing from fear of punishment, but from the love of the saviour.
- God's grace and forgiveness: the inclusion of the tax collectors in Jesus' ministry highlights that God's love and mercy extended to all who open their hearts to the Lord.
- **Social Barriers:** their stories challenge the religious and social norms of the time, illustrating how Jesus broke down barriers and embraced those whom society rejected.

To conclude, the tax collectors in the Gospel brings before us the God who is there always for us with His hands extended to embrace. Have a heart of humility to be in that embrace.


